
Always available and relevant



4. Search all learning materials

Search all learning materials from one place. Search results can be filtered by different types of content.

5. Help menu

Here you will find instructional videos and answers to frequently asked questions about Gleerups' digital learning materials. The help menu can be accessed from all learning materials.


6. Notifications

The pupil receives notifications when teachers have reviewed their submitted tasks. News from us at Gleerups are also displayed here.

7. Account settings

Overview within learning materials



1. Content

Here you can get an overview of all sections of the digital learning material.

2. Open

This button takes the pupil directly to the last place they were in the learning material.

3. From the teacher

If the teacher has distributed extra material, it will be shown here.

4. News

If there are news in the learning material, they are shown here.

5. About the learning material

Here you can find more information about the content of the learning material and its authors.

6. Get started

Here you'll find instructional videos, guides and answers to frequently asked questions about Gleerups' digital learning materials to help you get started in the best possible way.


7. Year selector

If the learning material covers a whole level, select the year here.

8. My results

Here you can see the pupil's activity in the learning material, and follow the results of the exercises and tests the pupil has performed.

Content and features - part 1



1. Table of contents

Navigate the content of the learning material via the image-based quick view or the text-based table of contents. Both are accessible from the same place.

2. Search

All content is searchable. It is also possible to filter based on different types of media.

3. From the teacher

This is where extra material distributed by the teacher is collected.

4. Split view

The icon with the two arrows opens the content in split view, side by side with the content that is already visible (the next

page shows an example of what a split view looks like).

5. Notes

Here the pupil can write independent notes.

6. Reading settings

Here the pupil can change the text size, background colour and font.

7. Offline

Under reading settings, it is possible to download sections for offline reading.

8. Highlights

All highlights and comments made by the pupil in the learning material are collected here.

9. Additions

If the teacher has made their own additions to the learning material and shared them with the pupil, they are collected here.


10. Native language guides*

Here the pupil activates native language guides.

11. Other tools

Depending on the subject, the pupil will find various useful tools under this menu, such as calculators and graphing calculators.

Content and features - part 2



1. Basic text/easy-to-read text

Many textbooks have both a basic text and an easier-to-read text.

2. ID

Each page has a unique ID to make it easy to find.

3. Good overview with split view

Open content in split view to be in two places at once.

4. Native language guides*

When the native language guides are activated, the icon appears here.

5. From the teacher

If the teacher has distributed extra material linked to a specific article, it is available here.

6. Deep linking/Share

Share a specific section of the learning material via a deep link or directly to Google Classroom or Microsoft Teams.

7. Listen

All texts can be read out loud using speech synthesis or pre-recorded speech*.

8. Built-in word explanation

Selected words have built-in explanations.

9. Highlight and comment

Highlight text and comment next to the highlighted section.

10. Listen

All texts can be read out loud using speech synthesis or pre-recorded speech*.

11. Dictionary

Highlight any word and get an explanation directly in the learning material.

12. Translate

Highlight text and have it translated into the language of your choice. The translation can also be read out loud.

13. Search in different services

Highlight any word and search in the learning material or on Wikipedia, Lexin or Google.
